False Information Circulating the Internet Concerning Methamphetamine

You may have received, or will possibly receive, an email containing information on flavored crystal methamphetamine—this is FALSE information. The Ohio Resource Network for Safe Communities has researched the authenticity of the information through contacting the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and has determined it to be false and inaccurate .

The Following is the erroneous information being circulated:

There is a type of crystal meth going around that looks like strawberry pop rocks. It smells like strawberry. Kids are ingesting this thinking it is candy and being rushed off to the ER. They call it strawberry meth or strawberry quick. It also comes in chocolate, peanut butter, cola, cherry, grape and orange. It looks just like pop rocks.



This information is being sent to inform parents, prevention and treatment professionals, law enforcement and educators of false information circulating the internet. Please distribute this information through list serves, newsletters or bulletin boards, etc. using the Ohio Early Warning Network and the Drug and Poison Information center at UC Children's Hospital as your source.
